The Amateur Radio Emergency Service® (ARES) consists of licensed amateurs who have voluntarily registered their qualifications and equipment, with their local ARES leadership, for communications duty in the public service when disaster strikes.

Polk County ARES is looking for licensed operators to work as Shelter Station Operators, EOC Station Operators, Net Control Operators, Skywarn Operators, and Deployable Volunteers. When an event occurs in Polk County or elsewhere, our communication skills may be needed to assure communications occur.
